Its political activities include attending conferences and meetings with public servants (political staffers), members of parliament and senators. They also include educating its constituency about political issues of note for the organization and engaging constituents in its political activities through conferences, speeches, workshops, the internet, and petitions. The greater public is engaged with and informed about international Justice Mission Canada's political advocacy through media releases, advertisements, speeches, publications, petitions, and the internet.

Political activities are conducted for the following purposes: to raise awareness about International Justice Mission Canada's work overseas, to advocate for increased funding from the Government of Canada for programs and initiatives that reduce the prevalence and incidence of violence against the poor in the developing world, and to advocate for greater enforcement of Canada's extraterritorial provisions for human trafficking and child sex tourism.
