

Before founding IJM in 1997, Gary Haugen served as the Director of the U.N. investigation in the aftermath of the Rwandan genocide, and as a human rights attorney for the U.S. Department of Justice. In 2012, he was recognized by the U.S. State Department as a Trafficking in Persons "Hero"—the highest honor given by the U.S. government for anti-slavery leadership.

Everyday Violence

In developing countries, violence is as much a part of daily life for the poor as are hunger, disease or homelessness. It devastates individual lives and prevents any efforts to rise out of poverty.

Everyday violence persists because basic criminal justice systems are too broken and corrupt to actually protect those in need. In fact, the UN states that 4 billion people live outside the protection of the law. As a result, criminals know they can rape, enslave, traffic and abuse the poor without fear of police, courts or the law itself.

International Justice Mission

IJM partners with local authorities to rescue victims of violence, bring criminals to justice, restore survivors, and strengthen justice systems.
